

2019 ASOTIN COUNTY HELLS CANYON LOCAL RODEO RULES

1. All entries are to be called in during the 3-hour call window of 6-9pm on April 9th, 10th, and 11th, 2019. No late entries will be accepted after call windows close each day, nor will they be accepted day of.
2. Check-in is Sunday April 28, 2019 at the arena level ticket booth, next to Bud's Cook Shack. Check in time is from 10:30am-12:00pm. All contestants must check in before 12:00pm, NO EXCEPTIONS.
3. Payment will be collected at Check-in and a Release Waiver will be reviewed and signed (check-in 10:30am-12:00pm) by the Parent/Legal Guardian prior to any contestant competing.
4. Each event has a limited number of contestants on a first come first serve basis. Upon an event being filled, contestants will be notified immediately while on the entry phone call.
5. All rodeo contestants in the arena at any time MUST have on western attire except for Goat Tail Tying & Untying: Long Sleeve shirt, jeans, cowboy hats, & boots.
6. Wool Ridin' contestants must wear a helmet, and vest when competing. There will be vests on hand, but they are not a one size fits all. It is recommended that contestants bring their own.
7. Wool Riders must be ages 4yrs – 7yrs, and NO MORE than 60lbs. (Weight Limit is for the safety of the animals.) Limit to 20 riders, first come first serve, NO EXCEPTIONS!!
8. All Wool Riders will ride out of the HCR Wool Rider Buckin' Chutes for 8 seconds. All riders will be timed and judged. Top 3 Wool Riders will go on to ride at the Lewiston Round Up in September.
9. ONLY ONE PARENT IS ALLOWED BEHIND THE CHUTES OR IN THE ARENA AT A TIME!
10. Steer Riding Contestants will have to have the proper protective gear, as described in the NHSRA (National High School Rodeo Association) rule book: All contestants must wear helmets approved for rodeo events, including both high school and junior high bull riders. All contestants must wear an Athletic Protective Mouth Piece while contesting. Mouthpiece may not be trimmed any smaller than the size required to cover all teeth. All contestants must wear a vest designed to protect the chest and back while contesting in the Bull Riding Event. The vest shall be one manufactured for rodeo/equestrian events and sold by retailers. This equipment will not be supplied by the Asotin County Hells Canyon Rodeo Directors, contestants must supply their own equipment.
11. Calf Scramble will have 2-man teams, catcher-catch-can. No horses are allowed in the arena during this time. Teams can catch the calf with any method possible. No ropes will be provided. First team to return to the chalk circle with the ribbon in hand, and hand it to the designated judge inside of the chalk circle wins.
12. Barrel Racing events will use the NHSRA (National High School Rodeo Association) Rule Book Rules.
13. All Barrel Racing Contestants must be on horseback when entering the arena to compete.
14. Pee Wee Barrels may be led by a parent and must be a single horse and rider to have a qualifying time.
15. Hats must stay on top of contestants' head thru the entry gate. Any Barrel Racing Contestant that loses their hat before entering the in gate will be DISQUALIFIED.
16. Asotin County Hells Canyon Rodeo Directors reserves the right to make any changes it deems appropriate in procedures, rules and course without notice.
